Responding to Tropical Storm Florence: How to Help **UMCOR Sunday - September 23**

Thank you for your generous giving last Sunday to UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) to help flood survivors in North and South Carolina. You gave \$1,930.00 on the spur of the moment.

This Sunday, September 23 has been designated as UMCOR Sunday. The very best way that you can give directly to the Disaster Response is to write a check to SFUMC and designate the gift as UMCOR - North and South Carolina. UMCOR is the Red Cross of United Methodism. Most of the time, we are the first to arrive on the scene and the very last to leave a disaster area. 100% of your gift goes directly to the location of the disaster.

Another way you can give is through participating in an Early Response Team - BUT NOT JUST YET! As soon as it is safe and possible, an invitation will come from the affected areas and will be shared with the South Georgia Conference. If you are interested you can call the North Carolina Conference directly at their Conference Center at 888-440-9167 and leave a message. They will call us when they are ready for teams.

This church, in the past on several different occasions, has collected and assembled cleaning kits (flood buckets) which are distributed to survivors soon after a disaster. This Sunday, September 23, buckets will be available for you to pick up and fill up with items requested by UMCOR. These items include: one 32-64 oz. bottle liquid laundry detergent, one 16-40 oz. bottle liquid concentrate household cleaner (no spray cleaner), one 16-34 oz. liquid dish soap, one 4-8 oz. pump spray air freshener, one 16-14 oz. pump spray insect repellant, one scrub brush, 18 re-usable cleaning wipes, five scouring pads, 36-50 clothespins, one 50-100 ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic), 24 roll of heavy duty trash bags (33-45 gallon sizes), five dust masks, two pair of kitchen gloves, and one pair of work gloves.
