I have used the above title several times when the time for the South Georgia Annual Conference arrives. While my wife, Susan is a member of this church, I am not since my membership was transferred into the South Georgia Annual Conference when I was ordained as a United Methodist pastor. In other words, the South Georgia Annual Conference is actually my church. Unless there is a very important need to convene a meeting during the year, my church meets once a year usually the first full week of June. This year, the Conference will begin with worship at 6:30 PM today (June 2) at the Columbus Convention Center in downtown Columbus, Georgia.

An equal number of clergy and laity are members of the Conference. Since we get two appointed clergy, our church has two lay members - John and Martha Ray. Bill Hatcher is also an At-Large Delegate.

At the Ordination and Commissioning Service on Monday evening at St. Luke UMC, two former staff members of our church will become members of the Annual Conference. Kirk Hagan, a former Associate Pastor, will be ordained and received as a Full Elder. David Donnan, our former Director of Student Ministries, will be commissioned as a Provisional Member of the Annual Conference.

On Tuesday morning, voting for clergy representatives to the 2020 General Conference and for the 2020 Jurisdictional Conference will be held. On Tuesday afternoon, voting for lay delegates will take place. South Georgia is entitled to four clergy delegates and four lay delegates to the General Conference, and in addition to these delegates four more clergy and four more laity will be elected as delegates to Jurisdictional Conference. The fallout from the vote on gay marriage and gay ordination at this year's called General Conference is expected to continue at the 2020 General Conference. At the 2020 Jurisdictional Conference, new bishops are elected. Since our Bishop will retire next year, South Georgia will receive a new Bishop in 2020. One can expect these issues to be topics of conversation.
