Generosity in Times of Grief

Our United Methodist Women (UMW) provides many valuable services to our church and also supports the cause of missions around the world. Many of our people may not be aware of the bereavement meals that are provided to the family when a member of our church dies. Several years ago John and Bab Lindsey began a "Funeral Meal Fund" which paid for the meat at each of these meals. As long as they were alive, the Lindsey's gave financially to this fund which allowed us to maintain a healthy balance. Although a few people along with grateful family members have also contributed, when John and Bab died, this fund began to decline. At their recent Board meeting, the Trustees voted to give \$2,000 out of undesignated Memorials to this fund so that the UMW would be able to continue this very much appreciated service.

I wanted to take this opportunity to personally thank the many members of the UMW for the time they devote to helping family members cope with the death of a loved one. The different circles serve on a rotating basis so that when there is a death, the appropriate circle leader is called. These women immediately inquire from the family as to the number of persons they will need to serve. The time is set once funeral arrangements have been made, and then the women cook some of the best "Southern cooking" one will ever taste. Most of the time, these meals are held in Room 306 instead of the Fellowship Hall. State regulations will not allow us to use the Fellowship Hall during Preschool hours Monday through Friday. On Saturdays, our Soup Kitchen is held in the Fellowship Hall. I am so grateful that these women appreciate and understand how the lack of space impacts this much-needed ministry. If you would like to contribute to the Funeral Meal Fund, you may do so by making your check payable to the church and designating it for funeral meals.

Memorial Funds

Instead of sending flowers to the funeral of a family member or friend, many times we send the church a check to the Memorial Fund in memory of that person. Sometimes the family will designate a particular fund that they desire for memorials to be used. These gifts could be designated for the New Building, the Music Fund, the Lindsey Funeral Meal fund, Backpack Buddies, Helping Hands, Childrens' Ministry, or Youth Ministry. When a giver designates a particular ministry to which they wish for their donation to be used, that gift goes directly to that designated fund. However, (and this the case most of the time), if there is nothing designated, then that gift goes into an undesignated Memorial Fund managed by the Trustees. As that fund grows, the Trustees are then able to approve purchases that benefit the church. As always, I continue to be grateful for the overwhelming generosity of this congregation. You continue to make a difference in people's lives. -Pastor Jimmy
