World Communion Sunday

During all four of our morning worship services today, we will celebrate World Communion Sunday. At our two Contemporary services in the Fellowship Hall at 9:01 and 11AM, each person will walk to the front and be given a piece of bread which will be dipped into the cup and then eaten. At the 8:30AM and 11AM Traditional services held in the Sanctuary, the ushers will guide each person to kneel or stand at the chancel rail. Communion servers will hand each person a piece of bread and a small cup of juice. Regardless of the method of serving communion, we are reminded that the broken Body and shed blood of Jesus Christ was the payment Jesus made for us so that our sins can be forgiven and we can receive the gift of eternal life.

Today we join with Christians all over the world to receive this Sacrament. Some will meet outdoors; others will meet in secret places due to fear of persecution. Some will meet in huts; others will gather in beautiful sanctuaries like ours. The Communion Table is the longest table in the world, and there is always room for one more.
